

MATERIAL

Velvet border 13 cm wide
Matching fabric for lining
Thin iron-on fleece
Rounded purse frame 10cm

LEVEL : medium

seam allowance: 5 mm

Knitting needle pouch



- 1 Cut a 92 cm velvet border, cut a cotton strip for the lining 92 x 14 cm and the same in the fleece.
(check with your knitting needle size)
Heat seal the fleece to the back of your lining.
On the reverse side, trace the shape of the clasp on each end of the velvet strip.
Do the same with the lining.

- 2 Fold the border right sides together, pin and stitch the sides upto the tracing.
Do the same with the lining but leave a 10 cm opening for turning.

- 3 Right sides together, join the velvet and lining by the rounded part to the notch.
(Remove the excess seam to make it easier to attach the clasp)
Turn the pouch over and close the opening with a few stitches
Iron the opening, protecting it with greaseproof paper.

- 4 Slide the fabric into the clasp and sew it with strong thread (start in the middle to avoid shifting when sewing).

Tip :Velvet is very easy to embroider, take advantage of this to personalise your pretty pouch even more!
Opt for thicker threads that will show up well, beads, sequins...
